

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – October 6, 2020

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, David Schwartz, Steven Cichos (via phone), Mark Klose, and Ramone Gumke answered the roll call.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova, to approve the September 2020 meeting minutes. Motion carried.

A motion to appoint Jessica Alonge as Interim Auditor/COO was made by Cichos, seconded by Gumke. The Personnel Committee hadn't discussed a temporary salary increase. Alonge is currently a Grade 20, Step 6. A recommendation of a temporary salary increase to Grade 23 was made. The Auditor's position is a Grade 26. Cichos made a revised motion to appoint Alonge as Interim Auditor/COO with a temporary salary increase to Grade 23, seconded by Gumke. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion to contract with Nicole Meland for FEMA, financial matters, and other duties at \$75 per hour, seconded by Gumke. Alonge would be the main point of contact. Roll call vote: Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Structure changes on the main floor were discussed. The Recorder and Treasurer positions would be combined. The Deputy Auditor would be free of the responsibility of the Recorder's Office but could take on some of the duties that are now assigned directly to the Auditor/COO. The Human Resources position could be elevated to a department head level and given more authority on the hiring side of things. Klose suggested meeting with the Personnel Committee for more discussion on this agenda item.

Auditor/COO job advertisement options were put together by Josh Smaage, IT Director. It would cost roughly \$1,250 for the job advertisements. A background check has been added to the job advertisements. Gumke suggested adding in a credit check. The job advertisements would run 10 business days. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Gumke, to approve the Auditor/COO job advertisements. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Ova and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Gumke, to approve the Resolution of Sponsorship for the Peterson Township grade raise. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Ova, Gumke and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion to remove Nicole Meland on all bank accounts and credit cards was made by Cichos, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz, to re-appoint Commissioner Gumke as the North Dakota State Fair delegate. Motion carried.

A discussion regarding tax foreclosure properties requiring appraisals was held.

A motion to set the tax foreclosure appraisal hearing date to October 20, 2020 was made by Schwartz, seconded by Ova. Motion carried. Having the appraisals back by October 16, 2020 was requested.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, presented his monthly report. There is confusion whether hearings are to be held in-person or via Zoom. There are some difficulties with seeing clear videos on the big screen for jury trials. Acoustics are a challenge with hearings held in the old courthouse. Felony numbers are back down.

Schwartz made a motion to change the commission meeting time to 8:00 a.m. on a trial basis (starting October 20, 2020), seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Gumke, Schwartz and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried. This topic should be re-visited at the second meeting in December.

At 4:45 p.m., the County Commission meeting recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

#### Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Park Board – October 6, 2020

At 4:45 p.m., the County Park Board meeting was called to order. Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke, David Schwartz, Steven Cichos (via phone), Mark Klose, Jason Houge, and Joan Morris (via phone) answered the roll call.

Houge made a motion, seconded by Schwartz, to approve the minutes of the September 2020 meeting. Motion carried.

Follow-up discussion regarding dock and cabin permits was held. Alonge had sent out proposed dock and cabin permits for after the land transfer is complete. No feedback had been received. Morris has a few clerical changes that she will send Alonge separately. The lease agreement would be for 3 years. The cabin committee recommended any increases in cabin permit rates not exceed 3% every three years.

Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent, presented his monthly report. An update of the North Dakota Farmer's Union camp was given. Parkhurst has been winterized. Bergh is looking at October 18, 2020 as the closure date of Lakeside campground for the season. The Park Department worked with the Road Department to winterize the irrigation around the courthouse building. This saves the County up to \$600. Docks have started to be moved out of the water. There are still docks at Pelican Point at this time. Trees have started being moved from the nursery. Unfortunately, the new growth on some of the trees have been wilted. The forester said they may have been hit with some farm chemical. He's hoping with some good watering they will rebound. Tom Schultz requested the Park Department to haul some regrid to Pelican Point so they can touch of some camping pads for next year. Two cabins at Lakeside need minor maintenance on the decks.

Houge made a motion, seconded by Cichos, to approve the cabin site transfer of 32 westside contingent on closing of the sale. Motion carried.

Sue Backer requested to pro-rate the 2002 cabin lease for 32 westside. Currently, the permit fee is not prorated upon transfer and the new owner is required to pay the annual fee. Houge suggested waiting until the County takes possession and then pro-rate. Discussion will be held at a later date.

Houge made a motion to approve the presented Jamestown Reservoir project application for cabin 20 westside, seconded by Gumke. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the monthly bills was made by Houge, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Houge, Morris, Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.
