

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – October 7th, 2014

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys, Dennis Ova, and Mark T. Klose answered the roll call.

Neys made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the minutes of the September 2014 meeting. Motion carried.

Casey Bradley, Auditor/COO, requested approval of the Juvenile Detention Service Contract which is provided by the State of North Dakota Department of Corrections and Rehabilitations (DOCR) and Youth Correctional Center (YCC). The contract is a renewal for 36 months at the per diem rate of \$185.85 per juvenile per day. Marks made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the contract as presented. Motion Carried.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Neys to approve canceling the November 4th, 2014 Commission meeting, changing the time of the November 18th, 2014 Commission meeting to 4:00 p.m., and giving permission to pay bills when they come due. A report will be submitted to the commissioners. Motion Carried.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to accept the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grant Award. The grant is in the amount of \$14,800 with \$3,700 being the county share for a grand total of \$18,500. Motion Carried.

Bradley, Auditor/COO, received a letter from the North Dakota Township Officers Association requesting consideration of supporting the organization with voluntary dues contribution for the unorganized townships in Stutsman County. It is \$125.00 per township and Stutsman County has two unorganized townships. Ova made a motion, seconded by Neys to approve the request as presented. Motion Carried.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to appoint Craig Neys to be the delegate for the North Dakota State Fair. Motion Carried.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to set the date of October 21, 2014 at 8:02 a.m. for the appraisal hearing for the property tax foreclosure. Motion Carried.

Casey Bradley, Auditor/COO, presented the commission with the personnel policy changes. The change for Chapter four is amending the vacation and sick leave policies as well as the policy for the implementation of the new evaluation process in Chapter nine. Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the policy changes as presented. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, and Klose voted aye.

Chad Kaiser, Sheriff, presented his monthly report. Kaiser stated the Sheriff's Office is at approximately 6,000 calls for service to date which is on average compared to last year. Kaiser requested acceptance of COPS Hiring Program (CHP) Grant in the amount of \$125,000 over a three year period. The CHP received 1,296 applicants; 215 applicants received the grant with only four applicants being from North Dakota. The local cash match is \$72,642. This grant program is to hire one officer position and retain the position for four years. Kaiser proposed to hire one officer with the COPS grant and train in Truck Regulatory due to the increase in traffic with CHS building at Spiritwood and moving toward a 24 hour operation. The fiscal impact of the COPS grant for Stutsman County is \$63,012 in 2015, \$3,579 in 2016, and \$17,626 in 2017. Ova made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve accepting the COPS Hiring Program grant as presented. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova voted aye.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve to hire and purchase the equipment for the one new position. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks voted aye.

Mickey Nenow, County Highway Superintendent, presented his monthly report. The Road Department is continuing to gravel roads, putting in culverts where needed, and hoping to start rocking once the crops come off.

Bradley, Auditor/COO, attended a pre-construction meeting. Due to the time sensitive nature of the CHS

project Bradley is requesting authorization for him to approve the change orders on behalf of the county for the CHS road. Bradley will coordinate with CHS since they are payers on the contract; if CHS approves the change orders then Bradley will approve the change orders. Neys made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to authorize Casey Bradley to approve written change orders for the CHS road. Motion Carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State’s Attorney, presented his monthly report. Fremgen informed the commissioners the scanning project will be completed by October 16, 2014 and will use approximately 95% of the authorized funding. The State’s Attorney’s Department is having trouble with looking up the scanned information. They learned if the file is not organized when it was scanned then it is harder to organize the information after it has been scanned. The State’s Attorney’s office will be working on implementing a protocol for scanning the documents in the future.

Casey, Auditor/COO, presented the 2013 audit report to the commissioners. Bradley reported the audit went well overall with the exception of two noted areas of concern: the county had overspent some fund budgets and the Pledge of Securities had a slight shortfall of the 110% coverage. The auditors did make a verbal notation regarding the challenges with the fixed assets. The county had a \$646,000 adjustment where departments disposed of items but the Auditor’s Office was still carrying the assets on the books. A Capital Asset Acquisition/Disposition form has been created for the departments to use.

Jim Fettig, Maintenance Supervisor, updated the commission board on the Senior Citizen Center Building. The Stutsman County Social Service Office, the Extension Agent’s Office and some other people expressed interest in the building. The parking and the zoning may become an issue if an entity wanted to do anything structurally to the building. On the east side of the building there is nine parking spots available and there are a few parking spots on the north side of the building. The libraries employees’ park there currently. Fettig stated the building has a new roof and a heating system; it is in good condition. It was recommended for the county to fill out an application with the City of Jamestown for rezoning the property. The application fee is \$200. Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the request to fill out the application with the city to have the property rezoned as presented. Motion Carried. It was suggested the Extension Office look at the building to see if it will meet their needs.

At 4:59 p.m., the Stutsman County Commission Meeting recessed for the County Park Board Meeting.

At 5:03 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Denny Ova, David Schwartz, Robert Woodward, Dale Marks, Craig Neys, Jason Houge and Mark T. Klose answered the roll call.

Houge made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve the minutes of the September meeting. Motion Carried.

Commissioner Klose questioned Dennis Lorenz if the Park Department still needs a landline at the shop. Lorenz stated he does receive quite a few people calling on the landline. Houge made a motion, seconded by Woodward to approve the monthly bills. Roll call vote: Neys, Klose, Houge, Woodward, Ova, Marks, Schwartz voted aye.

Darin Peterson, Cabin Owners Association Road Committee, informed the commission the committee would

like to pave the 290 feet of road from Agricover to the cabins. The bid price for paving the road came in at \$12,400. The county allots \$10,000 each year for the committee to use for the roads. The road also needs some repair due to the road washing out near the culvert. The committee is requesting to pave the 290 feet of road down to the cabins and to have the remaining funds carried over to the next year. For 2014, the road committee has \$5300 left because \$4,600 was used for dust control. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Houge to approve the remaining road funds carryover request into the next year as presented. Motion Carried.

Marks made a motion, seconded by Woodward to approve the transfer of Cabin Lot 7 East side from Doug Schlager to John and Susie Brandt contingent upon the paperwork being completed. Motion Carried.

The Campground Committee interviewed three applicants for the Concessionaire at Pelican Point Landing and Campground. The applicants were: Charles Wright/Lindsey Rowell; Alexa Kelley; Jeff and Christy Dowdy/Dean and Wanda Alber. The Campground Committee recommended the Dowdy/Alber group as the new concessionaire for Pelican Point. This is a five year contract and the county did not receive a request for revisions. The building needs a lot of cleaning as well as the inside grill top. It was suggested to do a walk through and create a checklist of what needs to be taken care of for the new concessionaires. Neys made a motion, seconded by Houge to approve the Campground Committee's concessionaire recommendation as presented. Roll call vote: Klose, Houge, Woodward, Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys voted aye. A meeting time will be set up to do a walkthrough of the building.

Sandra Eckelberg, Account/Property Coordinator, updated the commission on the FLAP program. The ND FLAP engineers still want to proceed with the access road to Pelican Point and they are trying to bid it out yet this fall; and give the contractors a notice to proceed on October 13th through October 20th. The engineers contacted Casey Bradley regarding the viability of when they could start construction. The engineers hope the project would be completed by June 1st. This may not happen. It depends on if road restrictions are still on in the spring. Only three contractors will be able to bid on the project because they meet the MATOC requirements.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, spoke last month regarding some troubles with a few campers at Spiritwood Lake and since there is not an ordinance in place the rules cannot be enforced. Lorenz and Sandra Eckelberg used the Bureau of Reclamations rules and regulations for Jamestown Reservoir as a guideline to create an ordinance for all Stutsman County Parks and managed lands. The goal is to try to cover all of the park lands in Stutsman County with one ordinance. Houge made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve Lorenz to direct Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, to draft a park ordinance by January 1, 2015. Motion Carried.

Dennis Lorenz presented his monthly report. Lorenz informed the board of a right-of-way fence issue. A person cut the fence line; the Park Department fixed the fence line and put a sign up stating the fence is property of the Bureau of Reclamation. The issue was brought up because the homeowner thought the fence line was on their property. According to the boundary markers the fence was not on their property. A walk gate was installed so the homeowners can access the park.

Lorenz informed the commission the Park Department is working on cutting and moving trees, pulling docks out of the water, and winterizing the concessionaire buildings.

The Bureau of Reclamation has started the evaluation process on their land and doing the market study on the cabin lots. The bureau is doing the study on all of the Bureau of Reclamation's properties.

At 5:43 p.m., a motion to adjourn the Stutsman County Park Board meeting was made by Neys, seconded by Woodward. Motion Carried.

At 5:43 p.m., the Stutsman County Commission Meeting reconvened.

Bradley, Auditor/COO, presented a budget review to the commissioners.

Bradley informed the commissioners the county received eight applications for the Deputy Treasurer position and interviewed five applicants. Bradley stated they did offer the position to one of the applicants

but it didn't work out. Bradley is requesting authorization to go up to a Grade 8, Step 13 of the Stutsman County pay scale. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve the request as presented. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose voted aye.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the monthly bills for payment. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova voted aye.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve the 2015 Budgeted Transfers. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks voted aye.

At 6:50 p.m., a motion to adjourn was made by Marks, seconded by Ova. Motion Carried.
