Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – November 1st, 2016

Approval of minutes from the October 2016 meetings and amendment to the September 6, 2016 minutes to correct the total wages amount. Schwartz made a motion to approve the October minutes and the amendment to the September 6, 2016 wages, seconded by Neys, motion carried.

Curt Kaseman, Jamestown Marksmanship- section 13 of Woodbury Township, Reuben & Clarice Liechty would like to offer 40 acres of land approximately 3 miles south of Jamestown. A meeting will be held Friday November 4, 2016 at the KC Hall 7p.m. there will be a township board meeting to ask them to rezone the property into commercial property. They would like to be shooting north and would need to build a baffle range to keep projectiles in range and reduce the noise. They would like to stay on the east side for access to the property; they will be in contact with the Highway department for road access. Marks made a motion to send a letter of support which will also include addressing the road pending Mickey Nenow's review, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, and Klose all vote aye, motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney- introduced Jeff Davis the new Assistant State's Attorney. Motion made by Neys to approve the incentive bonus for Jeff Davis, seconded by Ova. All aye, motion carried.

Christina Rittenbach, County Extension agent, requested out of state travel to Denver in January for Robin Barnes. Two 4-H participants made the national competition and need a chaperone. Motion made by Schwartz, seconded by Ova to allow Robin for the out of state travel.

Jessica Alonge, Stutsman County Treasurer, first meeting in September approved Breanna Garza as a signatory. Ova made a motion to remove Breanna Garza from the signing authority, seconded by Schwartz. All aye, motion carried.

Tom Tracy came to the commission to express concern about Stutsman County resources being used at the pipeline protests. He voiced his concern regarding the protests out in the western part of the state & does not agree with the Governor not using the National Guard to give relief to the law enforcement officers. He would like the county commissioners to contact the governor's office and encourage them to utilize the National Guard. Concern that there isn't enough protection left for county citizens.

Tami Dillman, Central Valley Health Unit, presented commission with board member changes. Currently 8 member board which includes 7 members, board discussed the open position and possibility of changing to a 7 member board instead of 8 since state law changed and a dentist on the board is no longer required. Ova made a motion to approve the change to the CVH Board, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose, and Ova all vote aye, motion carried.

Alison Grotberg presented windfarm project concerns she has. Grotberg presented an outline of points & fact sheet to review at the commissioners' convenience. Residents of Barnes & Stutsman counties are receiving contracts from the proposed windfarm. Stated majority residents are against the proposed windfarm. Grotberg stated the windfarm representatives gave non-resident land-owners contracts two months prior to resident landowners. Grotberg stated she had to request a copy of the contract. Casey Bradley, Auditor/COO, stated the county has not received any project applications for the proposed windfarm, the county will need to wait for the proposal

to see the impact to the county.

Mickey Nenow, Highway Superintendent, all projects completed except a few and the crews are currently chip sealing & graveling.

Tyler Michel, Assistant Highway Superintendant, requested to advertise for preliminary engineering on County road 44, 8 mile stretch. There would be a possibility to borrow out 2 years. Schwartz, Marks, Nenow, Michel & Bradley will be on the selection committee. Required to advertise for 2 weeks, already submitted to the newspaper to run in Thursday's newspaper with November 17th, 2016 as the deadline. There would be an 80/20 split with an estimate around \$2 million so around \$470,000 for the county share. Ova made a motion, seconded by Neys to proceed with the road project for County road 44. All vote aye, motion carried.

Bradley also informed the commission that the state is doing away with the bridge fund, roughly \$10 million was allocated by the state for future projects each year. Bridge by the stockyard road is slightly over the sufficiency rating, would like to discuss that bridge with the DOT and bring it back to board if they can get an approval.

Bradley presented a resolution to issue the bond for the University of Jamestown, no public comments were received on the bonds. MITA Bonds authority which goes through the county and if approved will then be issued with no liability to the county. Ova made a motion to approve the issuance of the bonds, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks all vote aye, motion carried.

Marks made a motion to approve the minimum bid amount for the foreclosure properties, seconded by Neys. All vote aye, motion carried.
