

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

November 3, 2009

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

A motion was made by Kaiser seconded by Neys to approve the minutes of the October 2009 meetings. Motion carried.

Neys made a motion seconded by Ova to make the following appointments to the Local Emergency Planning Committee: Marcie Bata, Major Harold Baugh, Scott Edinger, Dustin Lien, Jared Opp and Brian Paulson. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Bids were opened for a Rotary Reclaimer/Mixer. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Ova to accept the low bid of \$390,178 by Butler Machinery Company. Judy Graves spoke in opposition to purchasing the machine. The County had no long range road plan; there had been no public meetings to discuss reclaiming roads; no consideration had been given for potential expansion at the Spiritwood Energy Park; ND DOT's estimates for costs to maintain gravel roads had risen to \$4,800 per mile. The historical patching costs for the county in the past six years had only increased by 1%. She would initiate plans so a road committee could create a plan. The committee would go to the people for public comment. The County needed to apply valid criteria for prioritizing roads for recycling including potential future traffic. Roll call vote on the motion - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, gave his monthly report. The overweight ordinance had been put on hold pending an Attorney General's Opinion. If the AG issued an opinion that the Home Rule Counties could not pass an ordinance that would allow them to keep the fines, the Counties could go to the Legislature for that authority. The Commission would wait for the AG's opinion.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, gave his monthly report. The crews would continue hand patching paved roads; they were busy graveling FEMA spots and handling calls for motor grading roads.

Noel Johnson, County COO, reviewed the status of the Township road accounts. He recommended placing a County excess levy on accounts that were over one year old for those townships that did not have their own excess levy. The excess levy would go directly to the County to reduce the Township's balance owing. A motion was made by Neys seconded by Kaiser to place a 9 mill County excess levy on the following Townships: Chase Lake, Conklin, Corwin, Edmunds, Flint, Gerber, Marstonmoor, Peterson, Roosevelt, Sharlow, St. Paul, Valley Springs and Wadsworth. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Neys made a motion seconded by Kaiser to deny the request to close all of the section line between Sections 23 and 26 and between the NW1/4 of Section 26 and the NE1/4 of Section 27 in Griffin Township. Roll call vote - Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, reviewed the application process for the County to enroll in the National Flood Insurance Program. The enrollment would require an amendment to the County's Zoning Ordinance. The process would be reviewed with Mr. Klein at the State Water Commission and forwarded to the County Zoning Board.

Bergquist presented a contract with the ND Association of Counties and the ND League of Cities to conduct NIMS (National Incident Management System) training and a disaster exercise. A Homeland Security Grant would pay for the contract. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the \$22,500 contract. Roll call vote - Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.

Johnson presented a request from North Oakes Inn, LLC from Oakes, North Dakota for preference designation of the County's Recovery Zone Facility Bond Allocation waiver. Stutsman County had received a \$6.7 million Economic Development allocation and a \$10.1 million Facility Bond allocation. The low interest bonds could be used by private business or by local governments within the County. The County had the option to waive the allocation thus allowing the Industrial Commission to use the bonds for other projects around the state. The Commission chose to retain the allocations for potential projects within the County.

Dean Schmuhl, Lenton Township Chairman, requested a loan for their township to help pay a bill for repair of flood damaged roads until they received reimbursement from FEMA. Neys made a motion seconded by Ova to approve a \$10,000 loan from the General Fund Sub-account. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

At 5:12 p.m. the County Commission meeting was recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

Stutsman County Park Board Meeting

November 3, 2009

At 5:17 p.m. Chairman Klose called the Stutsman County Park Board meeting to order. Park Board members present were Bob Woodward, Mark Schlecht, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose.

Woodward made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the minutes from the October meeting. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Schlecht to approve payment of the monthly bills. Roll call vote - Woodward, Schlecht, Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Kevin Arthaud, ND Special Olympics, requested permission to conduct another Polar Plunge at the Jamestown Reservoir on February 13, 2010 for the benefit of the ND Special Olympics. Neys made a motion seconded by Woodward to grant the special use permit. Motion carried.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, updated the Board on the status of the FEMA applications for reimbursement of expenses from last spring's flood damage to Park facilities. Most of the paper work had been completed

Lorenz gave his monthly report. Footings were in at Pelican Point Landing for the new marina building. Efforts would continue to get the concrete floor and the garage floor poured before freeze-up. Clay was being hauled for the relocation of the Lakeside Marina building. If time allowed, the footings and concrete floor for that building would also be completed this fall. All but one boat dock had been pulled for the winter.

Fran Romsdahl and Ron Qual, representing the Jamestown Cabin Association reviewed a request sent to the Bureau of Reclamation to clarify the ownership of the access roads to the cabins. The Bureau indicated that they were not responsible for the roads and the Association should work with the Park Board. Johnson presented information on the amount of the rate increases to the cabin owners this year and information on the township and county property taxes that are paid by the cabin owners. The cabins owners would pay an additional \$11,720 in permit fees for 2010 and they paid about \$3,200 in township and county road taxes. A committee was suggested comprised of representatives of the Association, other non-association cabins owners, Midway and Fried Township Supervisors along with Park Board representatives to develop a budget and plan for maintaining the access roads (not private driveways). Ova made a motion seconded by Woodward to provide up to \$10,000 for annual access road maintenance. Roll call vote - Schlecht, Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Woodward voted aye.

Shirley Krapp, Spiritwood Lake City Auditor, presented a letter from the City of Spiritwood Lake that was to serve as a written agreement to insure that the fish screens that would be installed on the lake's drainage culverts would be maintained and kept clean by the City and the Spiritwood Lake Association. The County Highway Department would have the authority to remove the screens if needed, to prevent water from going over County Road 63. Ova made a motion seconded by Kaiser to accept the proposal. Motion carried.

A motion to adjourn was made by Neys and seconded by Woodward. At 5:47 p.m. the November 2009 County Park Board meeting was adjourned.

At 5:48 p.m. the regular Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Marks suggested a ballot issue as a cooperative effort between Stutsman County, the City of Jamestown and JSDC to place 1% county-wide sales tax issue on the June 2010 ballot. The money generated would be split 50/50 to the County and City to address infrastructure needs. Marks made a

motion seconded by Kaiser to explore the possibility of a 1% sales tax ballot issue with the City of Jamestown and JSDC. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Ova made a motion seconded by Kaiser to allow a full day holiday instead of a half-day holiday on Christmas Eve for County employees. Motion carried.

Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the monthly bills. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Joe Schmidt, County Resident, voiced concerns over corporate welfare to companies that received assistance from tax exemptions and funding from JSDC. He was disappointed with non-compliance by out-of-state construction workers with state income taxes and temporary motor vehicle registration fees. The taxes and fees were needed for county and state budgets. He opinioned that these companies were taking advantage of the community when they had \$100's of millions in profits and capitol assets. He suggested taking a better look at projects in the future.

A motion to adjourn was made by Ova and seconded by Marks. At 6:02 p.m. the regular monthly meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was adjourned.
