

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

November 6, 2007

At 4:00 p.m. the regular monthly meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Douglas Kaiser, Craig Neys, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, and Mark T. Klose.

A motion to approve the minutes of the October meetings was made by Ova and seconded by Kaiser. Motion carried.

Connie Ova, CEO-JSDC, presented a \$9,000 request (80/20 - City/County) by Jamestown Regional Airport for installation of tie downs to accommodate up to 3 cargo aircraft. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to approve \$1,800 in County funds. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye. The changes to the JSDC policy and procedures were tabled.

Rod Olson, Trial Court Administrator, and Chris Iverson, Trial Court Manager, reported on improvements that have been made to the courtrooms. Hearing impaired devices and other computer enhancements have been installed. District Court grant funds have also been used to make facility improvements.

The hearing on the minimum required bids for tax foreclosure property was held. No one appeared to protest the established minimums. Neys made a motion that was seconded by Ova to set the date for the tax sale as November 20, 2007 at 10 a.m. in the lobby of the main floor of the Stutsman County Courthouse. Motion carried.

Sandy Bendewald, Social Services Administrator, presented a proposal that converts the pay grades for Social Services from the ND State Central Personnel pay grade system to pay grades on the County pay scale. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to approve the pay grade conversion. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Tracey Trapp, LEC Administrator, requested acceptance of the bids for the security system upgrade at the Law Enforcement Center. The bids were as follows: Bergstrom Electric, Grand Forks - \$169,400; Hope Electric, Hope - \$248,000; Sun Electric, Fargo - \$214,900. A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks to accept the low bid of \$169,400 from Bergstrom Electric and to include an additional \$12,000 for contingencies. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Eunice Sahr, NDSU Extension Agent/Stutsman County, representing the Wellness Committee, requested approval of a program that would encourage employees to: participate in physical activities, in healthy lifestyle choices, and to practice healthy nutrition. Employees could be rewarded with up to 4 hours of comp time in a six-month period for program participation. Wendy Thompson, LEC nurse, indicated that the State Hospital had used it for many years. The County was receiving a discount in health insurance premiums for having a wellness committee and wellness programs. Neys made a motion that was seconded by Marks to approve the program for one year and to review the program after one year for possible future participation. Roll call vote - Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, gave his monthly report. Gravel crushing was completed. Crews were still hauling gravel and were and will be working on new restrooms at the county shop. He was having difficulty finding diesel fuel – current price was over \$3.30 per gallon.

Mr. Zimmerman reviewed changes to the County's culvert policy. Townships had paid for the first \$500 for culverts and the County had picked up the cost for anything over that amount. The new County policy would be that the Townships are 100% responsible for culverts under 48 inches in diameter. For culverts 48 inches in diameter or larger, the township would be responsible for 75% of the culvert cost plus installation and the County would assume 25% of the cost of the culvert. Determination of size and need and all recommendations would be made by the township overseer of roads, the Stutsman County Road Superintendent and the Local Water Board. Any hydrological studies that are required by law to meet Culvert Design Flood Frequency would be conducted with the expense of the study being paid by the entity wishing to have the culvert installed. When a culvert is used to replace a bridge that was constructed pursuant to NDCC 24-08-01, the County is responsible for all costs associated with maintenance and repair. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to adopt the new culvert policy effective immediately. Roll call vote - Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.

Mr. Zimmerman and Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, updated the Commission on a meeting that was held to resolve a disagreement between the Ypsilanti Road contractor, Gowan Construction,

and Charles Davis. Gowan had used a site provided by Davis. There was a verbal agreement that Gowan could use an old silage pit to dump refuse provided he filled the pit with the excess material from the job. The pit hadn't been filled to Davis' satisfaction and Gowan indicated that there was very little excess from the job. ND DOT would not final the project without a pit release from Davis. An additional 1,900 cu yds of fill was needed - \$6,950 was the estimated cost to fill the pit. The county had a borrow area that was culturally cleared that could be used to obtain the fill. At the earlier meeting, a tentative proposal would require Gowan to pay half the cost and Davis and the County would each pay 25%. Marks made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to pay 25% of the cost and to provide the fill from the borrow area. Roll call vote - Ova - aye, Marks - aye, Kaiser - aye, Neys - aye, Klose - nay. Motion carried.

Gene Guthmiller expressed his dissatisfaction with the results of the bid process for the grade raise on County 67 one mile south of Cleveland. He indicated that he was told that the rip-rap from the existing road could not be salvaged. He also had concerns about the bidders bonds. The successful bidder was salvaging the rip-rap which was a substantial cost savings compared to archeologically clearing many rock piles and hauling the rock onto the project. Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, indicated that he told Guthmiller to bid the job as he saw it. It was standard practice to salvage rip-rap. The project's low bidder was \$64,000 under Guthmiller's \$394,000 bid.

Ney made a motion that was seconded by Ova to place a 9 mill excess levy on the following townships pursuant to NDCC 57-15-30.1: Corwin, Deer Lake, Eldridge, Flint, Lippert, Moon Lake, Peterson, Roosevelt, Rose, and Wadsworth. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Tom Olson, Stutsman County Extension Agent, Cropping Systems, formally announced his retirement effective January 31, 2008. Michael Hanson, Extension District Director, explained the procedures to fill the position. If the County wanted to fill the position, his office would be willing to lead the application and search process. He recommended a committee for the interview and selection process. The committee could include one or two members of the Commission. Ova and Marks volunteered to be on the committee. The position was funded 50/50 between the extension service and the County. Noel Johnson, County COO, asked whether or not the extension service would consider relocating to another building to accommodate growth in the Social Services Department. Olson indicated they would consider it provided the new accommodations were equal to or better than their current facilities. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Marks to fill the position and to authorize Mr. Hanson and his committee to complete the hiring process. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova, and Marks voted aye. Mr. Olson was commended for his professionalism and for his years of service. He thanked the Commission for his years of employment.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, reviewed an emergency preparedness booklet that had been sent to all mailing addresses in the County. The booklet had been developed by his department and the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) with all costs paid by grant funds. A motion to nominate the following individuals to serve on the LEPC committee was made by Kaiser and seconded by Neys: Bert Gray, Larry Phillips, Jerry Bergquist, Jim Ash, Wayne Byers, Beth Dewald, Tami Dillman, Jim Dodd, Dave Donegan, Bill Dunaway, Jennifer Eckman, Chuck Furan, Fran Geisler, Doris Giedt, LeAnne Hayes, Noel Johnson, Jerry Kainz, Doug Kaiser, Craig Kopp, Eugenie Lang, Ray Martinez, Jack Meikle, Jim Michael, Nancy Miller, Major Tim Miller, Thomas Olson, David Orr, Jack Parisien, Brian Rau, Steve Reidburn, Jim Reuther, Brett Rima, Bjorn Ringdahl, Rick Scott, Kent Theurer, Tom Tracy, Russell Trautman, and Kathy Wicks Steiner. Motion carried.

Nellie Degen, Cabin Owner, presented letters of support for private ownership of the cabin leased sites at the Jamestown Reservoir. In September, 2006, the Commission had signed a document supporting purchase of the leased lots by the cabin owners. Legislation was proposed as a result of work by a lobbyist paid for by cabin owners that were leasing land from the Bureau of Reclamation. The Bureau of Reclamation had gone on record opposing private ownership of lands that they currently manage. Ms. Degen was requesting Commission support and assistance to help achieve goals to own cabin sites and/or to protect cabin owners' interests at the Reservoir.

States Attorney Fremgen's monthly report was acknowledged and placed on file.

At 5:42 p.m. the Commission meeting was recessed for the Park Board meeting.

At 5:47 p.m. the Stutsman County Park Board meeting was called to order by Chairman Klose. Members present were Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys, Mark T. Klose, Bob Woodward and Mark Schlecht.

A motion was made by Woodward and seconded by Ova to approve the minutes of the October meeting. Motion carried.

Woodward made a motion that was seconded by Schlecht to approve the bills. Roll call vote - Woodward, Schlecht, Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys, and Klose voted aye.

Mike Bitz, cabin owner, had submitted a written request that the Board reconsider his request for a refund that was denied at the last Park Board meeting. He had purchased the property as a year-around cabin before the central collection system option had been settled. He felt he was entitled to a \$1,400 refund, but would be willing to settle somewhere in the middle. Woodward made a motion to reconsider his refund request. The motion died for lack of a second.

The Board reviewed a written request by Paul Spitzer for a cabin conversion lease refund. His refund request had been submitted after the deadline of October 1, 2007. Schlecht made a motion that was seconded by Neys to deny the request. Roll call vote - Schlecht, Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose, and Woodward voted aye.

Schlecht made a motion that was seconded by Marks to grant septic system compliance extensions to Paul Spitzer and Darin Peterson and to Steve Looyen provided he submits a completed extension application form with all items addressed. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Woodward and Schlecht voted aye.

Senator Conrad was requesting comment from the County Commission on proposed federal legislation that would allow private ownership of the current cabin lease sites. Fran Romsdal, President of the Jamestown Reservoir Cabin Owners Association, indicated that the cabins owners that had attended a recent meeting with representatives of the congressional delegation had gone on record to abandon purchase of their lots. Emphasis was now on working to improve their leases for long term security. Meetings would be pursued to create a task force to revise agreements for the best interests of everyone involved. Ms. Degen commented that the change away from ownership was prompted by comments by congressional staff that had attended the meeting. The Board refrained from any letter of endorsement for Senator Conrad's proposed legislation until the issues had been resolved.

One bid from Mike Kessler had been received for the concessionaire contract at Lakeside Marina. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to send the bid to committee for review and for a recommendation. Motion carried.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, reported on dredging the channel east of the island at the Reservoir. A cost estimate of \$126,000 for the project had been received from Garrison Diversion. Funding for the project would be sought from the Bureau of Reclamation and other sources.

Mr. Lorenz gave his monthly report. The Phase II upgrade to the Pelican Point Campgrounds was almost complete. Three more cabins from Buffalo City Wood Products had been received and were placed at the Lakeside campgrounds.

Kevin Arthaud, James River Correctional Center, requested permission for the 2nd Annual "Polar Plunge" to be held February 16, 2008 at the Reservoir. Proceeds from the event would be donated to the ND Special Olympics. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to approve the event. Motion carried.

A motion to adjourn was made by Neys and seconded by Kaiser. At 6:37 p.m. the November 6, 2007 Stutsman County Park Board meeting was adjourned.

At 6:38 p.m. the Stutsman County Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to pay the monthly bills. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova, and Marks voted aye.
