

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

December 1, 2009

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

A motion was made by Kaiser seconded by Ova to approve the minutes of the November 2009 meetings. Motion carried.

Eunice Sahr, County Agent, representing the County Wellness Committee, requested continuation of the County's Wellness Program. Employees could earn up to 4 hours leave every 6 months for following and reporting a healthy lifestyle and exercise. The County received a discount in health insurance premiums for having a wellness committee. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Marks to extend the program for another year. Motion carried.

Ms. Sahr introduced Christina Masich. Ms. Masich would be assisting the County Agent's office for the next 12 to 18 months as an agent in training.

Deb Kantrud, South Central Dakota Regional Council, updated the Commission on the Council's activities. Community Development Block Grants had provided assistance for projects in Buchanan, Medina and Streeter. The agency was assisting with lead paint inspections and FEMA buyouts. The Small Business Development Center continued to provide support and council for developing businesses. Ova made a motion seconded by Neys to approve \$10,831 from the Jobs Development Fund for the County's share of the \$29,272 annual dues for SCDRC. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Connie Ova, JSDC-CEO, presented a request from the City of Jamestown for repairs to the wastewater treatment delivery system that provides service to Cavendish and the JSDC Ag Food Processing Park. JSDC Executive Committee recommended approval of 50% of the total cost or \$113,571 from the City Sales Tax Fund. A motion was made by Kaiser seconded by Ova to concur with funding \$113,571 of the request from the City Sales Tax Fund. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Ms. Ova presented a request for funding to repair the Center for Economic Development building. The estimate for JSDC's share of the cost was \$50,000 on an 80/20 City/County split. Marks made a motion seconded by Kaiser to approve the \$10,000 request. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Ms. Ova reported that Great River Energy was continuing to pursue a cellulose ethanol business partner at the Spiritwood Energy Park. Possible construction of a facility would depend upon a feasibility study that should be completed by 2010.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, gave his monthly report. He was collecting opinions on a possible County-wide fuel tax. Collection of the tax could be difficult without a mechanism to ascertain where the fuel was coming from and where it was being sold and to whom. Enforcement would also be an issue.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, gave his monthly report. Zimmerman requested permission to advertise for bids for 5 ER (Emergency Relief) projects next year. Marks made a motion seconded by Kaiser to bid the projects with a May 2010 bid opening at ND DOT in Bismarck. Motion carried.

Zimmerman was working on a bridge repair project in Sydney Township. The \$200,000 estimated cost of repair would repair the structure back to its original design. He would pursue options for a low-water crossing or other more cost effective alternatives that would make the structure more usable.

Zimmerman gave an update on the FEMA projects. FEMA project money was starting to come in.

Ova made a motion seconded by Neys to make the following County Board nominations: Stutsman County Park Board – Bob Woodward and Mark Schlecht; Social Services – Lynn Tally; Weed Control – Kim Lees and David Deutscher; Human Service Council – Sandy Bendewald; and Buffalo City Tourism – Marlyn Bertsch. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Kaiser to approve the following beer license renewals and Annual Sunday Beer Permit: Beer License Applications - Lucas Gudmestad & Shawndell Gudmestad-Moore d/b/a Hitching Post Bar; Jamestown Country Club; Ron Davis d/b/a Cuz'n Ron's Saloon; Joey Uehran d/b/a 281 Stop; Wayne & Hilda Kuntz d/b/a Sportsman Bar; Carmel Demaray d/b/a Windsor

Bar; Krewzer's Dream Inc. (Bob & Kris Wenzel) d/b/a Buchanan Bar – Annual Sunday Beer Permit - Krewzer's Dream Inc. (Bob & Kris Wenzel) d/b/a Buchanan Bar. Motion carried.

Neys made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the raffle permit applications of First Baptist Church and ND Junior Angus. Motion carried.

At 5:08 p.m. the County Commission meeting was recessed for the County Park Board meeting.
