Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – December 4, 2018

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke, David Schwartz, Steven Cichos and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

Commission reorganization was held.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Gumke to re-elect Mark Klose as Chairman of the Board of Commissioners. Motion carried.

A motion to re-elect Dennis Ova as Vice-Chairman of the Board of Commissioners was made by Gumke, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

The commissioners reviewed the current board appointments, as well as current board committees/portfolios/liaisons. It was suggested to remove the 'Landfill Committee', which is currently vacant. The 'Bureau of Reclamation Liaison' was also suggested to be removed.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve the minutes of the October 2018 and November 2018 meetings. Motion carried.

A new commission photo will be taken December 18, 2018 at 3:45 a.m.

Jerry Bergquist, Emergency Manager/9-1-1 Coordinator, spoke regarding County Measure #1.

Bergquist discussed the transition from CodeRED to Everbridge began November 1, 2018. The CodeRED contract is still in place until February 21, 2019. Everbridge will cost about \$5,000.00 less than CodeRED. There will be a flyer in with the 2018 tax statements. If individuals want to continue the services they had with CodeRED, they will have to register in the Everbridge system.

Motley Rice, Ferrer Poirot Wansbrough, Fears Nachawati and McNamee Hosea Law Firms presented on opioid litigation opportunities for Stutsman County. There would be no cost to the County. Counties of Burleigh, Grand Forks, Walsh, Ramsey, Towner, Rolette and Benson have signed on with the firms.

Corey Genter, Staff Appraiser, presented farm exemption abatements for Parcel # 01-1213000. The Alexander Township agreed to go with any decision the Stutsman County Assessment Board makes regarding this matter. Genter's recommendation was to approve the abatements for 2016-2018 as presented. A motion to accept the presented abatements was made by Schwartz, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

A monthly report was presented by Mickey Nenow, Road Superintendent.

Nenow requested to advertise for a new motor grader. Cichos made a motion, seconded by Gumke, to approve the request to advertise. Motion carried.

A request to approve and award the bid to Border State's Paving, Inc. for the SC 4718(060) Project, Buchanan West (5 miles) 2019, was made by Nenow. Schwartz made a motion approve and award to bid as presented, seconded by Gumke. Roll call vote: Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Nicole Meland, Auditor/COO, discussed a compensation study and FLSA (Fair Labor Standards Act) review. The City of Jamestown will be participating and sharing the cost. The last time a salary study was done was around 2014-2015. This will be a partial Stutsman County study. A motion to go forward with the study was made by Ova, seconded by Gumke. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Ova and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

Meland presented updated sale prices for County-owned properties obtained through the foreclosure process. On November 5, 2018, the City of Jamestown approved allowing Stutsman County to lower the current sale prices to estimated amounts from Tyler Perleberg, Tax Director. Gumke made a motion, seconded by Schwartz, to approve the updated sale prices. Motion carried.

Robert Martin was the only applicant for the Weed Board for a 4-year term, commencing January 1, 2019. Ova made a motion to approve the presented nomination and re-elect Martin, seconded by Cichos. Motion carried.

Lynne Tally was the only applicant for the Social Services Board for a 3-year term, commencing January 1, 2019. Schwartz made a motion to approve the presented nomination and re-elect Tally, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

The Park Board received 5 applicants for the 2 open positions for 3-year terms, commencing January 1, 2019. These applicants included the following names: Jason Houge, Robert Martin, Mary Margaret Mooridian, Joan L. Morris and Kent Lane Warren. Robert "Bob" Woodward is retiring after 30 years of being on the Stutsman County Park Board. A vote was held and Houge received 5 votes. Morris received 3 votes. Warren received 1 vote. Mooridian received 1 vote. Cichos made a motion, seconded by Ova, to re-elect Houge and elect Morris. Motion carried.

Cichos made a motion to approve a year-end check run on December 31, 2018, seconded by Gumke. Motion carried.

A request for approval of the 2019 beer and liquor licenses for the Anchor Bar, Ypsilanti Bar & Grill, 281 Stop, Windsor Bar, Sportsmans Bar, Buchanan Bar, Stutsman County Fair Association, Inc. and Jamestown Country Club were made. Ova made a motion to accept the presented 2019 beer and liquor licenses, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

Bergquist requested acceptance of the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grant Award in the amount of \$9,200.00. This is an 80/20 grant. The 20% portion would be from the County (\$1,840.00). A motion to accept the grant as presented was made by Cichos, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

A request for approval of submission letters for Hazard Mitigation Planning Grant application was made by Bergquist. Schwartz made a motion to accept the presented letters, seconded by Gumke. Motion carried.

At 5:10 p.m., the Stutsman County Commission Meeting recessed for the County Park Board Meeting.

Woodward made a motion to approve the October 2018 and November 2018 minutes, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Houge, to approve the monthly bills. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Woodward, Houge, Ova, Gumke and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

Meland presented an Electronic Data Release and License Agreement regarding the contract with KLJ for the master plan for the Lakeside Campground. Schwartz made a motion to approve the presented agreement, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

A discussion was had regarding the DAK electric bills and camping remittance. June was the only month of payments that was received from the DAK. The DAK pays the County 20% of camping fees, per the contract. It also states Stutsman County should receive payment by the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month following the previous month. Stutsman County has requested monthly financials and has not received those and have had no response to the electric bills that were sent to them. Meland proposed withholding a certain amount of money and keeping a balance in the account until payments have been made to the County for the DAK. The DAK has violated the contract several times.

Meland requested registering "Lakeside Campground" with the Secretary of State as the new business name. This would be a \$25.00 fee to register the name change. A motion to approve the request of registering the new name was made by Ova, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

A motion to adjourn the Stutsman County Park Board meeting, at 5:32 p.m., was made by Schwartz, seconded by Gumke. Motion carried.

At 5:32 p.m., the County Commission Meeting was called back to order.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz, to approve the bills as presented. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Gumke, Schwartz and Cichos vote aye. Motion carried.
