

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – December 17, 2019

At 4:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Mark Klose, Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke, David Schwartz and Steven Cichos answered the roll call.

The next meeting will be moved to January 7, 2020 at 8:00 a.m.

Emeline Burkett, Director of Social Services, presented proposed Human Zone Board terms for Stutsman County board members. Gumke made a motion to have Commissioner Cichos serve a 3-year term, Member Gayle Nelson to serve a 1-year term and Member Tracy Johnk to serve a 2-year term, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Doreen Stroh, City of Jamestown Appraiser, presented three abatements for the following parcels: #74-3372700, #74-3770520 and #74-7227000. Schwartz made a motion to approve the recommendations presented by the City, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Ova and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

Chad Jackson, Stutsman County Correctional Center Administrator, requested out of state travel for himself and another employee for a conference in Colorado. Ova made a motion to approve the presented request, seconded by Gumke. Motion carried.

Two new job descriptions for Communications Specialist and Lead Communications Specialist were presented. Schwartz made a motion to approve the presented job descriptions for the Communications Center and to allow an internal job posting for Lead Communications Specialist for up to three positions, seconded by Gumke. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Ova, Gumke and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

Gumke made a motion, seconded by Ova, to approve the presented promotion policies for the Auditor, Treasurer, Recorder and Tax Equalization departments and Sheriff's Office. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Gumke, Schwartz and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried.

Nicole Meland requested approval of promotions for Corey Genter (Stutsman County Property Appraiser), Shannon Larson (Stutsman County Human Resource Specialist) and Haylee Albrecht (Deputy Treasurer), effective January 1, 2020. A motion to approve the requests was made by Schwartz, seconded by Cichos. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Cichos made a motion to approve the presented Sheriff's Office promotions for Deputies White, Davis, Muske, Hirschert, Holzworth and Schwanz, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion to renew the Cass County Mutual Aid Agreement was made by Ova, seconded by Gumke. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Ova and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

A 6-month extension of the current 9-1-1 Equipment Maintenance Contract was requested by Jerry Bergquist, Emergency Manager. A motion to approve the requested extension was made by Ova, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Ova, Gumke and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion to close the rural voting precincts for Pingree, Kensal and Medina was made by Schwartz, seconded by Cichos. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Gumke, Schwartz and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Gumke, to approve the following presented established precincts for the 2020 election cycle: Precinct 1, Precinct 2, Precinct 3 with Jamestown School, Precinct 3 without Jamestown School, Precinct 4 with Jamestown School, Precinct 4 without Jamestown School, Precinct 5 with Jamestown School, Precinct 5 without Jamestown School, Precinct 6 with Jamestown School, Precinct 6 without Jamestown School, Precinct J1, Precinct J2 with City, Precinct J2 without City, Precinct J3, Precinct J4, Precinct J5 and Precinct J6. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Gumke, to approve the following polling locations for the 2020 election cycle: Stutsman County Courthouse (all precincts for absentee and early voting) and the Jamestown Civic Center (all precincts on election day).

Nicole Meland presented an audit agreement for a company called SpyGlass. SpyGlass reviews telecommunication and network service billings for cost savings. The board asked for savings that other entities have obtained from these services.

A motion to deny the requests of December 24th 8:00 a.m. to noon closure and December 31st noon closure was made by Cichos. The motion failed due to a lack of a second.

Schwartz made a motion to approve the request of December 24th 8:00 a.m. to noon closure and leave December 31st as is, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Schwartz – Aye, Cichos – Nay, Klose – Aye, Ova – Aye. Motion carried.

A motion to approve taxable meals and bills was made by Cichos, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Ova and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.
