

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

Sept. 2, 2008

The September 2, 2008, special meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was called to order at 2:00 p.m. by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose.

Judge John Greenwood, SE District Court Judge presented and explained the 2009 District Court budget. He presented a letter in support of the Community Corrections Program.

Jim Fettig, Courthouse and Memorial Building Maintenance Supervisor reviewed budgets which included \$140,000 in renovations at the Memorial Building.

Noel Johnson, County COO, reviewed all the budget requests.

At 4:25 p.m. the special meeting was recessed and the regular September 2, 2008 meeting was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose.

A motion to approve the August 2008 minutes was made by Kaiser, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Warren Tobin, Veteran Service Officer requested permission to allow his office to be closed Sept. 15, 16 & 17, 2008 so he and his staff can attend training. A motion to allow the closing of the office was made by Ova, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

Noel Johnson, County COO, presented the Requests for Proposal for the digital mapping of the City of Jamestown. There were four firms that submitted proposals. It is the recommendation of the committee to award the contract to Interstate Engineering at a cost of \$4,500. A motion to award the contract to Interstate Engineering at a cost of \$4,500 was made by Kaiser, seconded by Neys. Roll call vote - Ova – aye, Marks – aye, Kaiser – aye, Neys – aye and Klose – aye. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen presented his monthly report. The Child Support Enforcement Unit has lost their attorney and is requesting the State's Attorney fill in as needed for Prosecution of Criminal Non-payment of Child Support. A motion to enter into agreement with the Child Support Enforcement Unit at a billable rate of \$34/hour, with the right to say no was made by Neys, seconded Kaiser. Roll call vote - Marks – aye, Kaiser – aye, Neys – aye, Klose – aye and Ova - aye. Motion carried.

The regular meeting was recessed at 4:36 p.m.

Fritz Fremgen presented the proposed drawing scheme for Cabin Site Lot 1 East Side, Jamestown Reservoir. There is no cost to enter the drawing, it will be a ballot box drawing, no name can appear more than one time, only one entry per person, and all the entrants will be drawn down. The cost to be paid by the accepting entrant is \$36,060, which is the county’s cost for attorney fees and demolition of the cabin. A motion to require \$5,000 earnest money down and balance in 30 days was made by Marks, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, informed the board that the Jam the Dam went well and is being planned again next year. The old boat ramp at Pelican Point is breaking up and needs to be removed. Lorenz was told to remove as much as they can and get estimates to have the rest removed.

At 4:57 a motion was made to adjourn the Park Board meeting was made by Kaiser, seconded by Neys. Motion carried.

At 4:58 the regular meeting was called back to order.

Noel Johnson, County COO, continued budget review. Outside funding requests were reviewed. Jamestown Regional Airport will remain at 1 mill; Community Corrections Program will receive \$7,500 from Law Enforcement Center Fund; Gackle Ambulance will receive \$1,200; and Jamestown Area Ambulance will receive \$15,000.

A motion to fund the Sheyenne James Resource Conservation District at the 2008 amount of \$150 and the Woodworth Fire District at the 2008 amount of \$250 for Roosevelt Township on the condition they submit their funding requests to the Auditor’s Office by September 30, 2008 was made by Ova, seconded by Neys. Motion carried.

A motion to fund the Art’s Center, Stutsman County Museum and the Frontier Village at the amounts requested and to have Buffalo City Tourism submit the request to have the funds disbursed to the proper entity was made by Marks, seconded by Kaiser. Motion carried.

A motion to cover the approximate 8% increase in health care premium costs with no increase to the employee's share was made by Neys, seconded by Marks. Roll call vote – Kaiser - aye, Neys - aye, Klose - aye, Ova - aye and Marks - aye. Motion carried.

A motion to accept the following expenditure and revenues changes as presented without an additional deputy in the Sheriff's Office was made by Ova, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.
